



## SECURITY POLICY

The Company recognizes the security threats present in today's world and is committed in detecting and taking preventive measures against security incidents on board our vessels. The Company aims in running ships that are secure not only for the ship itself and the cargo and personnel on board, but also for the Port and other facilities they are using. In achieving this objective, the Company shall put in place the following:

- 1) An approved Ship Security Plan on all the vessels managed by the Company, in accordance with the requirements of SOLAS Chapter XI-2 and the ISPS code.
- 2) Impart necessary training for the Master and the crewmembers with respect to their role in the Ship Security Plan.
- 3) Give necessary shore-based support for the execution of the Ship Security Plan, as and when requested by the Company Security Officer, the Master of the ship and the Ship Security Officer for matters concerning the security of the ship.
- 4) Seek opportunities to learn from experiences and continually improve the plan.

The Master of our vessels will have the overriding authority and responsibility to make decisions with respect to the security of the Ship.
